Before fisheries biologists officially surveyed Ward Pond, stockings of rainbow trout and brook trout were made. These stockings failed to provide substantial fisheries. When the pond was first surveyed in 1953, it was evident that the pond was best managed for warmwater sportfish.

In response to angler inquires regarding the fishery at Ward Pond biologists introduced largemouth bass. A resurvey in 1963, revealed an abundant population of young largemouth bass, indicating that bass were established. The bass fishery continues to provide good fishing.

Increased development is expected to occur near and around Ward Pond. This development may place more demand on the pond's fishery and may be detrimental to water quality if proper environmental practices are not employed.
