Dyer Long Pond provides excellent habitat for warmwater fish. Although some small smallmouth bass are found in this pond they are not abundant enough to provide good fishing. Largemouth bass have become established in recent years and should provide a good fishery.

Sea-run alewives utilize this pond for spawning and adequate provisions for fish passage should be provided in the small dam at the outlet.
