Little Dyer Pond is relatively shallow with a maximum depth of 19 feet. An oxygen deficiency exists at depths of 15 feet and over. Poor spawning and nursery habitat is available for coldwater sportfish. Therefore, management is for the present good smallmouth bass fishery.

There is no state-owned boat launch facility on Little Dyer Pond. Launching a canoe at an unimproved facility located on the outlet stream will provide access to both Little Dyer Pond and Kerr Pond.
