

HAVENER POND

Waldoboro Twp., Lincoln County and Warren Twp., Knox County U.S.G.S. Waldoboro East, Maine

Fishes

Largemouth bass Chain pickerel Hornpout (bullhead) Pumpkinseed sunfish

Physical Characteristics

Area - 83 acres

Temperatures: Surface - 76⁰F 10 feet - 74⁰F

Maximum depth - 11 feet

Principal fishery: Largemouth bass

Havener Pond lies at the headwaters of the Goose River. Extensive growth of aquatic plants characterizes this pond. Chain pickerel were the principal fishery in this pond until 1967 when largemouth bass were stocked and became established.

The water level for Havener Pond is regulated by beaver dams on the outlet. Although these dams are not permanent they are important to maintaining an adequate water level. Without these dams the pond would be much shallower and probably less desirable for fish management.

A public boat landing is located at the north end of the pond.
