Physical Characteristics

Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, chain pickerel, white perch

James Pond provides excellent habitat for warm water fishes. Largemouth and smallmouth bass migrated into the pond via the Sheepscot River and now provide good fisheries. While landlocked salmon and brown trout have been captured in James Pond (migrants from the river) there is no viable fishery for these species.

The only public access is via the Sheepscot River.
