
McCurdy Pond contains a variety of warmwater fishes. Smallmouth bass have been caught from this pond during the past two summers, but how bass were introduced here is unknown. Bass in McCurdy Pond have now spread into other waters in the Pemaquid River drainage, including Pemaquid and Biscay Ponds. These ponds contain ideal habitat for smallmouth bass, and in a few years bass fishing should contribute greatly to summer angling in all of these waters.

Oxygen is completely lacking in the colder layers of Mc-Curdy Pond during the summer months. Management for

coldwater fish is not recommended.
