Physical Characteristics

Area - 216 acres Temperatures: Surface - 76° F Maximum depth - 16 feet 15 feet -68° F

Principal fisheries: Smallmouth bass, largemouth bass, white perch

Sherman Lake is a shallow lake ideally suited for warmwater fish management. Largemouth bass were introduced in 1969 and now provide an attractive fishery with many large bass reportedly caught each year. The sea-run alewife population provides excellent forage for largemouth bass.

Experimental brown trout stockings occurred in the 1950's in an attempt to establish a fishery but when returns to the angler were low the program was terminated.

Warmwater species management should be continued for Sherman Lake.
