Sidensparker Pond, in the St George River drainage, is characterized for its shallowness, its warm water, and its abundant growth of aquatic vegetation.

Ideal habitat for largemouth bass exist in Sidensparker Pond and the Department introduced this species in 1958 and 1959. This introduction was successful and bass have become well established.

Access to Sidensparker Pond can be gained from the north shore from an unimproved launch site.

It is recommended that no coldwater fish species be stocked.
