
Results of the 1958 biological survey of Bunganock Pond indicated suitable habitat for largemouth bass, and 5,000 largemouth bass fingerlings were stocked in July 1959 to bolster the declining fishery.

These bass should have entered the fishery in 1962. Angler success for largemouth bass is best in the late evening or early morning by casting surface lures in the vicinity of weed beds, old brush piles, and sunken logs.

Additional stocking is not necessary because of this species'

ability to maintain itself by natural reproduction.
