
Furlong Pond is a small, undeveloped water nestled amongst the hilly terrain of Greenwood. The majority of the pond contains water less than 10 feet in depth, and much of this area supports extensive weed beds.

The deeper areas of the pond thermally stratify during the summer months; however, a severe oxygen deficiency develops at 3-5 feet in depth. As a result, the pond is not suitable for trout management, and the remote nature of the pond makes it a poor candidate for a put-and-take stocking program.

This pond is best managed for the existing warmwater fish species. The fishing is limited to small pickerel and some people utilize the pond for baitfish. The nature of this pond makes it susceptible to winter kill, which reduces its fishery potential. A four-wheel drive camp road, Old Greenwood Rd., goes into the northern tip of the pond. There is no public access, but anglers may gain access via permissive trespass.
