Goodwin Pond is located a near the western shore of Mooselookmeguntic Lake. The pond has a small inlet entering the northwest corner of the pond. The muddy outlet flows east into the nearby lake. The pond's undeveloped shoreline is surrounded by softwood forest and sphagnum bog.

Water quality in Goodwin Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. Water temperatures reach critical levels for salmonids in this shallow pond. No suitable spawning or nursery habitat is present for trout. Despite these conditions a fishery for brook trout is maintained through annual stockings.

Goodwin Pond is accessible via a short foot trail leaving Wildwood Cove of Moose- lookmeguntic Lake. The pond is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the summer and closed to icefishing. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
