Mollidgewock Pond is located south of Umbagog Lake near the Maine - New Hampshire border. The main inlet is boggy with numerous beaver ponds. The pond's outlet flows west between the Hampshire Hills of New Hampshire. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Mollidgewock Pond is suitable for coldwater gamefish. The presence of chain pickerel, however, limits the pond for salmonid growth and survival. The pond has good spawning and nursery habitat in the outlet, which is utilized by a small brook trout population. The pond is not stocked.

Mollidgewock Pond is accessible via a series of gravel logging roads south of Route 26 near the Maine - New Hampshire border.
