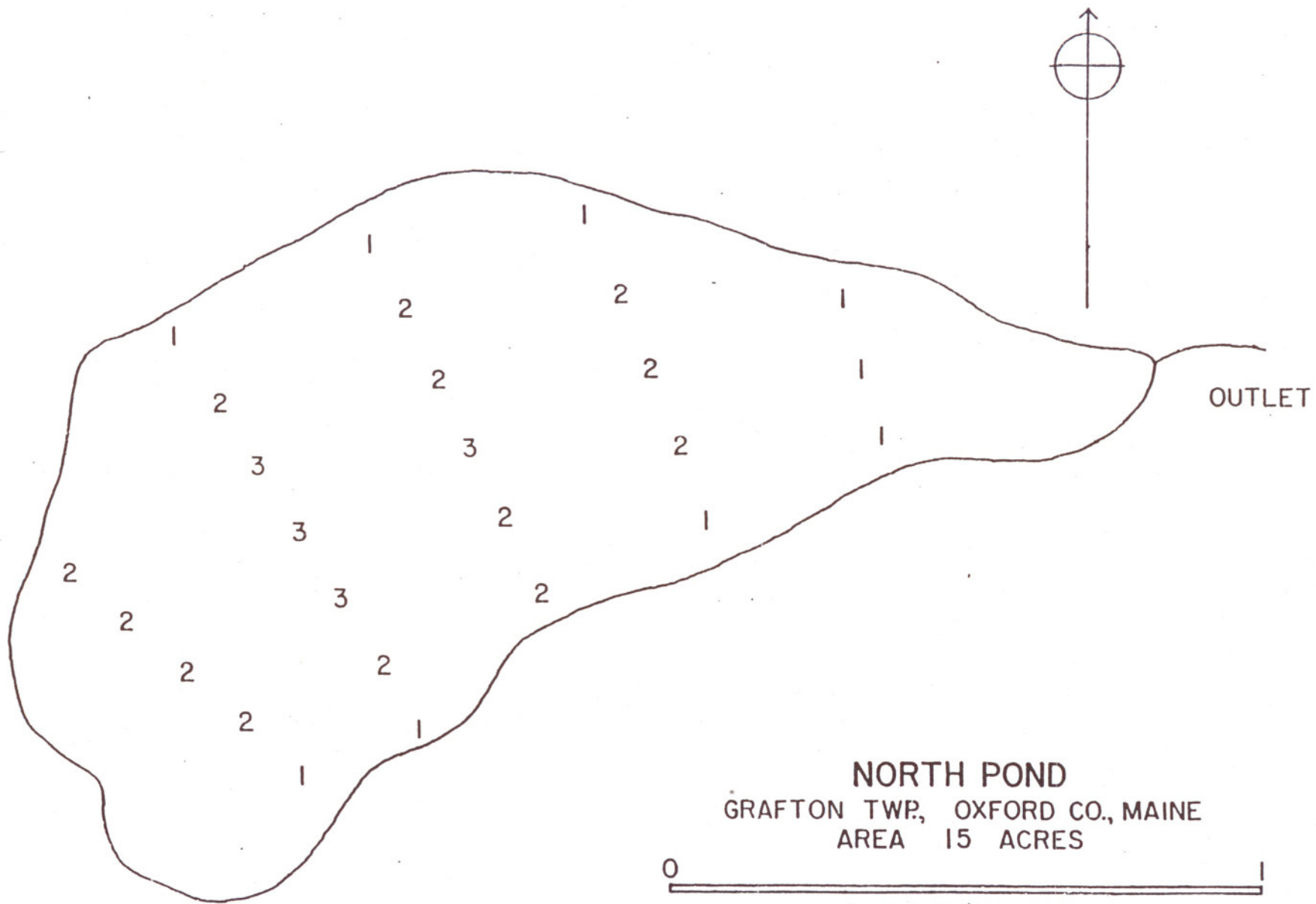

North Pond is located north of Old Speck Mountain. The pond has no inlets, but a swampy outlet seeps east into the Swift Cambridge River. The pond's boggy shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in North Pond is poor for cold-water gamefish. The pond, surrounded by sphagnum bog, is very shallow with a soft muddy bottom. In the warm summer months water temperatures reach critical levels for salmonids. No fish species were observed during the original survey. The pond is not stocked.

There is no direct road access to North Pond, but a woods road off the Success Pond Road passes within a quarter mile of the pond. The pond is open to fishing under general law in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter months.
