Fishes

Yellow perch Chain pickerel Minnows Golden shiner Hornpout (bullhead) Pumpkinseed sunfish American eel

Physical Characteristics

Area - 16 acres

Maximum depth - 25 feet

Principal fisheries: Chain pickerel

Plain Pond is a small, undeveloped water with a remote character. There are extensive wetland areas around the pond and down along the outlet, which provide excellent habitat for aquatic animals. The pond itself is ringed with a narrow band of aquatic weeds and shoreline areas quickly drop-off into deeper water. This pond is managed for the existing warm water fish species.

The pond thermally stratifies each summer and develops a severe oxygen deficiency below 10 feet. This poor water quality along with heavy competition and predation pressures from warm water fish precludes any trout management.

A privately owned access road is located off the Mine Pond and Bickford Pond Roads. Although there is no public right-of-way, anglers might get permission from the landowners to access the pond.
