


MIDAS # 3138 SOUTHEAST POND

Area - 173 acres

Principal fisheries: Largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, and chain pickerel

Although Southeast Pond thermally stratifies during the summer months, a severe oxygen deficiency develops below the thermocline. This seasonal condition, coupled with the presence of competing and predatory warmwater fish species, severely limit opportunities to manage for coldwater fish. Water quality is considered suitable for warmwater fish and listed species are the focus of current management.

There is no designated public boat access to Southeast Pond Angler access occurs by permissive trespass. Existing public access opportunities are considered inadequate and there is a need for improved public access.
