

## **Physical Characteristics**

Area - 46 acres Temperatures:

Maximum depth - 11 feet 10 feet - 72°F

Principal fisheries: Smallmouth bass, chain pickerel, black crappie

George Pond is a small weedy warmwater pond ideally suited for the species currently present. Both the smallmouth bass and black crappies have migrated into George Pond from Hermon Pond. The many different species coupled with the abundant populations of those fish has caused the fish to become stunted.

George Pond provides an excellent opportunity to introduce children to the sport of fishing because of the fast action.
