Round Pond should be managed for warmwater species. Most of the pond has a depth of less than 20 feet and maintains equal water temperatures at the surface and bottom.

Largemouth bass were first observed during routine netting in 1993. The bass population probably became established from fish emigrating from Plymouth Pond located downstream. Currently the bass population is low in numbers but considering the favorable habitat the population should continue to increase.

No stocking is recommended at this time.
