Suggested Management

Big Benson Pond has very good water quality for coldwater game fishes and should be managed for lake trout. Salmon were introduced many years ago but the lack of spawning facilities has apparently prevented natural reproduction and they have not been reported for many years.

Some brook trout are present but the lack of spawning facilities has kept the population down to a minimum. An experimental brook trout stocking was made in the fall of 1955 and will be checked later.

Spawning facilities could be improved by removing the heavy accumulation of debris at the outlet. The debris completely obstructs the stream during low-water periods.

A number of competing species is now present and further introductions should be avoided.
