Little Caribou Pond is a scenic little pond surrounded by a mixed growth ridge having a stand of cedar around the immediate shoreline. A ledge outcropping is present along the south shore and makes for an impressive gorge on the outlet. Pitcher plants and sundew plants were observed growing in various locations around the shoreline.

Little Caribou supports a wild population of brook trout that must compete with numerous white suckers, yellow perch and various minnow species for food and space. As a result natural trout numbers are low. Use of the inlet and outlet for trout spawning and nursery areas is limited by the amount of gravel and warm water temperatures.

Vehicle access is over private gravel roads built and maintained by industrial landowners for forest management purposes. A 15-minute walk on a footpath completes access to the pond.
