Suggested Management

Caucomgomoc is a large and very productive lake with good water quality for coldwater game fishes.

Large populations of white and yellow perch have, by their competition for food and space, practically eliminated the brook trout from the lake habitat.

A small population of lake trout is present but there is no large area of very deep water to sustain a good fishery for this species.

Salmon are better suited to withstand the competition from the species present and there are excellent spawning and nursery areas in Loon Stream and in the outlet. It is recommended that salmon be stocked annually until a self-sustaining population is established. A fishway should be constructed in the outlet dam to allow free migration for salmon and trout.
