Chase Lake is a relatively remote northern Maine lake. It is surrounded rolling wooded hills, and is undeveloped except for a North Maine Woods campsite located on the northeast corner of the pond.


Chase Lake water quality conditions are considered fair for coldwater game fish. Although the deeper water is cold, an oxygen deficiency develops below 20 feet in late summer. Salmon and brook trout production is compromised due to the water quality

limitations and competition from other fish species for available food and space. Brook trout spawning and nursery areas are considered good in the tributaries.

Access to Chase Lake is via private gravel roads built and maintained by large landowners for forest management purposes. An unimproved boat landing exists at the North Maine Woods campsite and is suitable for smaller watercraft.
