

Upper Ellis Pond is an extremely shallow pond that is reaching the end of its productive life. Several ledges protrude up through the otherwise muddy bottom. The shallowness and muddy bottom may result in an oxygen depletion under the ice in the winter, causing periodic winterkills.

No game fish were found in the survey, but minnows and white suckers were seined near the outlet. The limited gravel areas in the outlet and southeast tributary are heavily silted and offer very poor spawning habitat for trout.
