Fogg Pond is a beautiful little mountain pond. The nearby mountains and spruce forest provide a picturesque setting for the wilderness pond angler.

Water quality and lack of competitors make Fogg an ideal squaretail pond. There are no permanent inlet brooks and the outlet brook is only intermittently above ground, thus the native wild trout population is maintained by spawning in the lake.

Continuation of the fly fishing only regulation should help prevent introduction of unwanted species. The alternate year closings planned for the pond (beginning in 1971) are designed to produce good fishing for larger trout.

Fogg Pond is accessible by foot trail only.
