Gauntlet Pond is a typical isolated pond combining magnificent scenery with good squaretail fishing. The pond is located in a beautiful mountainous area bordered by several nice stands of spruce and pine.

Water quality in Gauntlet is fine for brook trout and adequate spawning grounds are available in the tributaries. Good angling in the pond is protected by several natural barriers on the outlet brook which prevent the immigration of undesirable species.

Prohibition of the use of live fish as bait is recommended to prevent the introduction of rough fish by anglers.

Gauntlet Pond is reached via a foot trail off the G.N.P. Jo Mary Pond Road.
