The shoreline of Hebron Lake is highly developed. There are many private camps and homes situated around the lake. The Town of Monson is located on the southeast shore. The lake is easily accessible by paved road on the north, east and south shores.

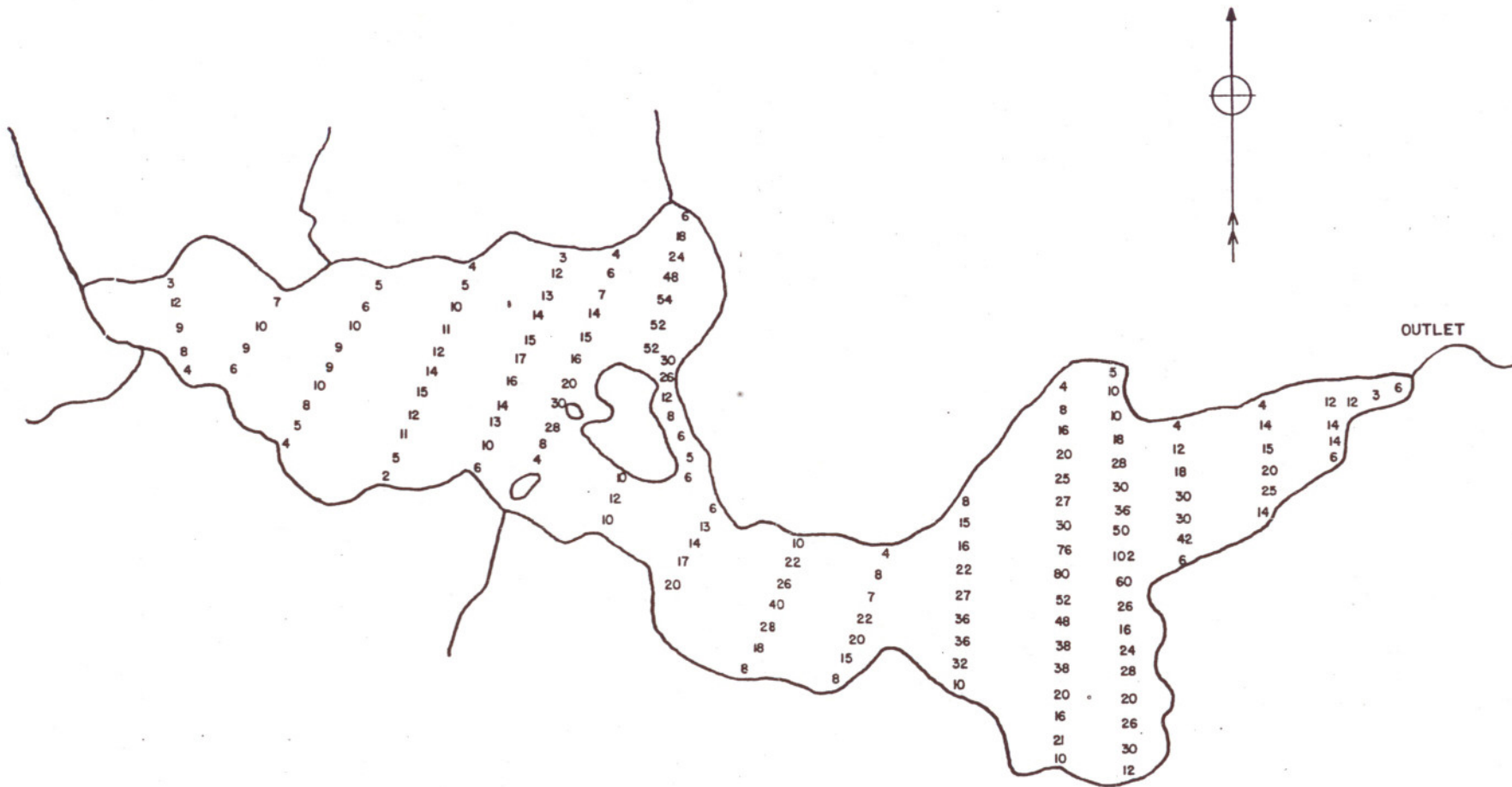
Hebron Lake has two basins. One is deep and contains cool, well-oxygenated water suitable for coldwater gamefish. The other basin is shallow and warm. This basin is more suitable habitat for warmwater species.

The tributaries and outlet have minimal potential for salmon and trout natural reproduction.

A 25-year stocking program failed to produce a significant salmon fishery in Hebron Lake. Lake trout continue to thrive through natural reproduction. Recent stockings of brook trout have made a positive contribution to the sport fishery and have been well received by fishermen.

Hebron Lake should be managed for lake trout and brook trout. Due to the absence of suitable spawning habitat, brook trout should be stocked annually.
