Jewett Pond is a typical bog-type pond with a floating mat of bog plants making up much of its shoreline. Except for a ring of trees around the pond, the surrounding timber has been removed completely. The bottom is a thick layer of flocculent silt several feet deep. Ecological succession has proceeded so far that this pond has only a very limited potential for fish.

The high water temperature during hot weather precludes managing this pond for anything but the abundant bait minnows found there. Present regulations are adequate.

There is a fair gravel road close to the pond.
