## Suggested Management

Monson Pond has very good water quality for coldwater game fishes and should be managed for brook trout and lake trout. The tributaries provide excellent spawning and nursery areas for brook trout and should be kept free from obstructions.

The outlet is filled with a tangled mass of debris and should be made passable for migrating fishes.

Suckers, smelts, sunfish and chubs are serious competitors and are undoubtedly limiting the brook trout population. Care should be taken not to introduce more competing species such as the white perch, yellow perch, or pickerel.
