
Munsungan Lake is a scenic headwater lake of the Aroostook River nestled with a forested shoreline at the base of Norway Bluff. It provides ideal habitat conditions for coldwater gamefish. Cold temperatures and high dissolved oxygen values prevail in late summer at depths below 15 feet, providing an abundant water volume suitable for salmon and lake trout.

Salmon spawning and nursery areas are available in the outlet, Munsungan Stream. Lake spawning areas for lake trout have not been documented but are known to be present to sustain the native population. The various tributaries are used discriminately by rainbow smelt and brook trout for spawning purposes.

The sport fishery in Munsungan Lake emphasizes existing wild populations of lake trout, landlocked salmon, and brook trout. Very conservative fishing regulations may be necessary to maintain and protect the wild salmon fishery as it now exists.

Vehicle access near to Munsungan Lake is available via improved private gravel roads maintained by large landowners for forest management purposes. Light watercraft may be launched by an unimproved four wheel drive access near the outlet or must be hand carried from this or other roads in close proximity to the shoreline.
