Shadow Pond is a small, deep, spring-fed pond without a definite outlet. It has no major inlets, but a small tributary flows through the road culvert on the west side of the pond. There are no spawning or nursery areas in this tributary.

The water quality is excellent for trout, with a sufficient volume of cold, well-oxygenated water.

The pond lies on the east side of Route 15 just $\frac{1}{4}$ mile north of Greenville Junction. Small boats may be carried a few yards into the pond, or backed into the pond with a 4-wheel drive vehicle.


Shadow Pond was reclaimed in 1963 to reduce competing species and to permit intensive management for brook trout. Conditions for growth and survival should be greatly improved by reclamation. The future fishery will be supported by annual stocking.

Special regulations now in effect on Shadow Pond are:

- 1. Five trout daily limit.
- 2. Use or possession of live fish as bait prohibited.
- 3. Closed to ice fishing.

These regulations are designed to distribute the catch among a greater number of fishermen and to prevent the reintroduction of competing species.
