Suggested Management

Sewell Pond contains suitable habitat to support a good largemouth bass fishery. In 1955 a largemouth bass was reported taken by a fisherman angling at this pond. Once well-established these fish should provide excellent angling in this small body of water.

Sewell Pond serves as a spawning site for adult alewives which enter the pond each spring. Young alewives are an excellent forage fish for largemouth bass. The outlet of Sewell Pond should be maintained free of obstructions to allow alewives access to the pond to spawn each year.

No other species should be introduced or stocked.
