Little Berry Pond is one of several small trout ponds clustered to the east of Parlin Pond. Historically, access was via a two mile portage from Parlin Pond. Recent logging activity has improved road access into the area. Several drive-in campsites have also become established around the cluster of ponds.

The water quality at Little Berry Pond is adequate to support brook trout. Several young-of-the-year brook trout were observed in the inlet. This is the only tributary with spawning and/or nursery habitat. Recent beaver activity on the inlet could restrict access for spawning adults.

Little Berry Pond should be managed for wild brook trout. Regulations should be designed to protect the wild trout in light of increasing use in this area.
