Chase Pond is located between Baker Pond and Wentworth Pond. The shoreline is boggy with abundant aquatic vegetation. There is a small inlet in the northwest corner of the pond which flows in from Baker Pond. The outlet flows east into Wentworth Pond. The shoreline is undeveloped.

The water quality for coldwater species is poor with heavy competition from warmwater species. A few brook trout are present, but not in sufficient numbers to maintain a fishery. Chase Pond is not stocked.

Chase Pond is accessible via a trail from the Solon Road. The pond is open to general law fishing in the summer.
