Dead Stream Pond is located west of the Kennebec River Gorge. Dead Stream enters the west side of the pond from nearby Mud Pond, then exits flowing southeast into the Kennebec River. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Dead Stream Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Ample spawning and nursery areas are available for wild brook to utilize and maintain a fishery. Growth is good with only light competition from creek chubs. The pond is not stocked.

Dead Stream Pond is accessible via a series of gravel logging roads off Route 201. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer months and is closed to fishing during the winter. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
