Fahi Pond is a shallow, warmwater pond located southeast of Embden Lake. Fahi Pond's outlet flows into Mill Stream just upstream of the Carrabassett River. A dam on the outlet maintains the water level.

Normal summer water temperatures are critically high for coldwater game fish, and the occasional brook trout taken at Fahi Pond are probably migrants from the inlet streams. Competition from warmwater fish further diminishes the pond as coldwater fish habitat.

Fahi Pond's marshy riparian zone provides excellent wildlife habitat, and is a Wildlife Management Area managed by the Department.
