Frypan Pond is located north of Burnt Nubble. A small inlet enters from the east and its outlet flows west into Black Brook. The pond's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Frypan Pond is marginal for coldwater gamefish. Despite this, a population of brook trout utilizes a limited area of spawning habitat to maintain a fishery. Growth is good even though the summer water temperatures are high and the competition from minnow species is heavy. The pond is not stocked.

Frypan Pond is accessible via a series of gravel logging roads off the Indian Pond Road. The pond is open to fly fishing only in the summer and closed to fishing during the winter months. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
