Horseshoe Pond is located northeast of Moxie Pond. The pond has no major inlets, but an outlet flows west into Alder Stream. Its shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Horseshoe Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. A population of native brook trout utilizes spawning and nursery habitat in the outlet to maintain a fishery. Growth is good despite competition from golden shiners.

Horseshoe Pond is accessible via a series of woods roads north of the Shirley Mills Road. The pond is closed to fishing in the winter. See the lawbook for openwater regulations. Surveyed - July, 2002
