Principal fisheries: Brown trout, brook trout, rainbow smelt, smallmouth bass, chain pickerel, white perch

Stockings of both brown trout and brook trout are necessary to maintain any coldwater fishery due to the lack of suitable spawning and nursery habitat. Smelt provide an attractive handline fishery.

Lake George provides ideal smallmouth bass habitat. Although largemouth bass populate Oaks Pond located down stream and anglers have reported largemouths in Lake George, fishery personnel have yet to document this species.

A well maintained boat launching is located at a state park located at the south end of the lake off State Route 2.
