Little King Lake is located southeast of King and Bartlett Mountain. The major inlet enters the north end of the pond from King and Bartlett Lake. It's outlet flows south into Spencer Stream. The lake's shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Little King Lake is good for coldwater gamefish. The pond's inlet provides sufficient spawning and nursery habitat for native salmon and brook trout populations to maintain fisheries. Brook trout growth is good with only light competition for food and space. Smelts are available for salmon to use as forage. The pond is not stocked.

Little King Lake is accessible via private gated roads east of Route 27. The lake is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
