Macdougall Pond is located a short distance east of the Kennebec River above Wyman Lake. The pond has no major inlet or outlet and its shoreline is undeveloped.

Water quality in Macdougall Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. The steep shoreline and lack of tributaries preclude any opportunity for salmonid spawning, so brook trout must be stocked annually to provide a fishery. Trout growth is good with no competing species in the pond.

Macdougall Pond is accessible via Route 201 north of Bingham. The pond is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the summer months and closed to ice fishing.
