Mayfield Pond is located north of Foss Mountain. Inlets entering the north and south corners include Bigelow Brook. The pond's outlet is a wide thoroughfare into nearby Kingsbury Pond. Its shoreline is partially developed.

Kingsbury and Mayfield Ponds are managed as a unit, because a thoroughfare that allows free migration for fishes joins the two. Water quality in Mayfield Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Salmon and splake are stocked and provide fisheries. Growth is good, despite heavy competition from other fish species, because a healthy smelt population provides forage to the salmonids.

Mayfield Pond is accessible via the thoroughfare from Kingsbury Pond. A boat launch site is located at the northeast end of Kingsbury Pond. The pond is open under general law in both the summer and winter fishing seasons. See the lawbook for additional regulations.
