Mountain Dimmick Pond is located high on the east side of Dimmick Mountain. The pond lacks any major inlets, but an outlet flows northeast into Big Dimmick Pond. The shoreline of the pond is mostly undeveloped.

Water quality in Mountain Dimmick Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Spawning and nursery habitat is lacking in the pond with only limited amounts of gravel available in the outlet. Annual stockings of brook trout are necessary to provide a fishery. Competition is light with only small numbers of suckers and minnows to compete with for food and space.

Mountain Dimmick Pond is accessible via a trail located near the outlet of Big Dimmick Pond. The pond is open to fishing with no live fish as bait in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter.
