Pleasant Ridge Plt., Somerset County U.S.G.S. Bingham, Maine (7½'), U.S.G.S. Caratunk, Maine (7½'), and U.S.G.S East Carry Pond, Maine (7½')

Rowe Pond is located west of Wyman Lake. Two small inlets enter the pond from nearby Brandy Pond to the north and Beans Pond to the east. Its short outlet flows northwest into Jewett Pond and then Jewett Stream. The pond's shoreline is lightly developed.

Water quality in Rowe Pond is good for coldwater gamefish. Only a limited amount of spawning gravel is present in the pond's tributaries, so brook trout and salmon are stocked to provide fisheries. Both salmonid species grow well in the pond with only light competition and smelt for forage.

Rowe Pond is accessible via the Rowe Pond Road. The pond is open to fishing under general law in the summer and closed to fishing in the winter.
