
Sibley Pond provides an abundance and variety of habitat for warmwater fishes. This pond once supported a good fishery for smallmouth bass, but only a small population of smallmouths are now present. The preponderance of aquatic plant life makes this pond better suited for largemouth bass. Largemouths were introduced by Department biologists in 1970 and presently provide an attractive fishery.

White perch are numerous and anglers should find this delicious panfish enjoyable sport. The presence of black

crappies have been confirmed, adding another dimension to Sibley Pond's diverse fisheries.

The public may access Sibley Pond by way of the old Route 2 roadbed.
