Swan Lake, located in eastern Waldo County, is the headwater of the Goose River. Much of this lake's shoreline is developed with seasonal and permanent homes, and a small State Park is present on the north shore. Some access for the public is available at two undeveloped sites, both of which are located at the south end of the lake off Route 141.

Swan Lake provides good habitat for a variety of coldwater fishes. Landlocked salmon, which are stocked annually, are the most popular attraction. The lake also supports a small population of wild togue. Special regulations restrict harvest of wild togue until they reach spawning age. Experimental stockings of fall fingerling brook trout have been made since 1982,

with sporadic results. Stockings of larger spring yearling trout, initiated in 1991, should result in better returns to anglers.

Swan Lake also supports good populations of smallmouth bass and white perch. These species are maintained through natural reproduction.

Anglers can assist the Department of Inland Fisheries and Wildlife in monitoring our management program at Swan Lake by keeping a record of their fishing trips.
