

Bog Lake is a relatively, remote water situated several miles northwest of Rocky Lake in Whiting. Access is via the "Dodge Road" off Route 1 in Whiting. From Route 1 travel 6.9 miles, then take a left onto a four-wheel drive road, which takes you to the pond. Small boats/canoes can be slid into the water after a short carry.

The lake supports a modest population of wild brook trout, and a large population of small yellow perch. The trout population results from fish moving up the outlet, which connects with Rocky Lake Stream, a fair trout stream. Although anglers have caught trout up to 13 inches, most fish average about 9 inches. Recent angler reports indicate that the trout fishing has declined due to increased competition from other species.
