Roaring Lake is one of several small- to medium-sized lakes that make up the Orange River drainage. When the outlet dam is holding a head of water you can motor up the outlet to the lake. Otherwise you will have to row or pole your boat. To get to the outlet dam take the dirt road running North from Rt. 1 near Lively Brook in Whiting and bear right.

Roaring Lake is a shallow lake suited for warmwater game fish. Except for a boggy area at the north end, the shorelines are steep and wooded. Yellow perch are common and grow to a fair size. Brook trout live in the small brook which flows into the lake from the Northeast, and occasionally you may catch one in the lake during the cool seasons.

No stocking is recommended.
