
Sucker Lake is a scenic lake located right beside East Grand Lake into which it flows. To get there you must fly or walk to it from East Grand. There is no access road.

At the present time we recommend management for the assemblage of warmwater game species already present. There is a very small volume of water, cool and well-oxygenated enough for salmon or trout, but it is not thought that these species would thrive in this marginal habitat in the presence of the abundant competitors.

East Grand, just a stone's throw away, provides fishing for salmon and togue.

Pond reclamation is not feasible in this isolated area due to cost and the lack of a good location for a barrier dam near the lake.
