

Suggested Management

Little Tomah Lake is reported to have supported a satisfactory brook trout population until recent years. Reclamation to reduce competing species and subsequent trout stocking might re-establish a moderate trout fishery. However, the pond's geographic location and probable light fishing pressure make reclamation impractical at this time. Reclamation costs would approach \$2,000.00.

It is unlikely that stocked brook trout would co-exist satisfactorily with the warmwater fishes established. No stocking is recommended.
