Little Boyd Pond is located on the South side of "Mill Turn Road", directly across from Boyd Pond. Dense mats of floating vegetation ring the shoreline of this Pond. The dark-stained water overlies a soft bottom consisting of mucky silts. There is no visible inlet or outlet and the pond does not thermally stratify in the summer. The entire water column is well oxygenated, providing suitable water quality for resident warmwater fisheries. Little Boyd Pond is managed for warmwater fisheries.

There is no known public boat access to Little Boyd Pond; however, a small trail provides foot access to the north side of the pond. Permissive trespass affords anglers access, but this public access opportunity is tentative and could be terminated in the future. There is a need to secure permanent public access provisions to this pond.
