INTRODUCTION

This Consent Agreement is entered into by and among Dana E. Boucher, the Maine State Board of Nursing (hereinafter "the Board") and the Department of the Attorney General, State of Maine. ON September 19, 1990, the Board voted to revoke Mr. Boucher's license to practice as a registered professional nurse in the State of Maine without proceedings, pursuant to 5 M.R.S.A. Section 1004(1), based upon his statements to State Police, Togus V.A. hospital police, and Detective Susan Randall of the Department of the Attorney General regarding the theft of personal property from patients and staff and the diversion of drugs from various hospitals at which he had worked, and the resulting September 10, 1990 revocation of Mr. Boucher's intensive supervision provision by the criminal justice system. When Mr. Boucher was served with a notice of revocation, he immediately surrendered his license to Detective Randall, pursuant to the terms of the notice.

By letter dated October 1, 1991, Mr. Boucher requested the Board to consider reinstating his license. An informal conference was held on December 17, 1991 at which Mr. Boucher appeared with legal counsel, Pasquale J. Perrino, Jr., Esq. After the conference, the Board decided to enter a Consent Agreement as follows.

COVENANTS

Pursuant to 32 M.R.S.A. Section 2105-A(1-A)(C), the Board voted to reinstate Mr. Boucher's license to practice nursing for a probationary period to end on October 4, 1992. The Board will take no further action against Mr. Boucher on this matter if Mr. Boucher meets the following conditions:

1. Mr. Boucher must continue counseling with Susan C. Olivares, CSW/IP, so long as she considers necessary. Mr. Boucher must arrange for quarterly reports to be sent from Ms. Olivares regarding his progress so long as he continues with his counseling, and must arrange for a final report to be sent to the Board from Ms. Olivares

if the counseling is terminated before the end of this probationary period.

- 2. Mr. Boucher must arrange for quarterly reports concerning his performance to be sent to the Board from any nurse employer.
- 3. Mr. Boucher waives any claim of confidentiality or privilege with respect to reports required by this Consent Agreement.
